Customer can drive vehicle in Greece with foreign plates for six months. After that period vehicle has to be re-exported or registered in Greece and get Greek plates ▪ Payment of taxes/duties when applicable the amount depends on vehicle's cc, model, type, and gas exhaust measurements etc. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Regarding motorbikes, their chassis has to have at least seventeen (17) digits. ▪ Either car or motorbike has to be under the latest European manufacturing standards (in order to get Greek plates. ▪ It is highly recommended that you contact with your destination agent to determine first of all if vehicle can be registered into Greece and if so, what the cost would be.
